Advanced Placement (AP) The Basics

Started in 1955 by the College Board



Purpose of taking AP in high school:

 Take enriched, university-level coursework, while building confidence with the support and guidance of AP teachers


 Potentially earn university credits with qualifying scores on AP Exams

AP: Credit + Placement Opportunities



- AP exams are scored on a scale of 1-5
- Most universities will give course credit for grades of 4 or 5 on an AP exam
- University of Calgary examples:
- A grade of at least 4 on the Biology AP exam will earn a student credit in BIOL 243
 - A grade of at least 4 on the Chemistry AP exam will earn a student credit in CHEM 201 and 203
- In Canada, AP courses aren't typically required for entrance into post-secondary programs. Advanced credit is given upon admission

Alberta Curriculum and AP Material



- To receive credit for Alberta high school courses, students are assessed only on Alberta curriculum
- Course-awarded marks for 30 level diplomas are assessed on curriculum objectives set by Alberta Education
- Students who take AP courses do not have their Alberta education transcript negatively impacted
- AP material is assessed only on AP exams and on specialized courses that students enrol in to prepare for the AP exam
- Students in AP courses may find themselves better prepared for Alberta Diploma exams

AP vs IB



Similarities

Enriched academic program

 College credit can be earned based on exams scores

Differences

- Granting college credit is based on AP Exam score, written in May
- Courses are "a la carte"

Flexibility is key!

 Student write the IB Exams in addition to completing other requirements




Common Questions

1. Is there a grade requirement to take AP courses?

2. Is the course load intense?

- 3. Is there time for extracurricular activities, athletics or a part-time job?
- 4. Should students be concerned about AP exams?



- Flexibility Students may choose to take one or more AP courses
- Students have exposure to enriched curriculum by enrolling in **AP-Cohort courses** in grades 10-11
- Students have the option to re-evaluate their course paths each year
- Since not all AP courses fit into a student's timetable, support from Guidance Counselors are available for AP course selection choices
- Motivated Self-Study Students may independently challenge certain AP exams for credit
- *Course offerings are subject to enrollment numbers*

AP Exams



- Students take AP Exams at the end of the course. The exams are written over a twoweek period in May
- Depending on the Course, the exams consist of
 - Multiple Choice (most courses)
 - Long Answer (most courses)
 - Essay
 - Portfolio (Art)
 - Voice Recording (Languages)
